### **Positive Behaviour for Learning**

# **To be a Tregeagle Eagle...**

***Be Safe, Be Respectful and Be a Learner  
by being safe in an emergency.***



We are focusing our Positive Behaviour for Learning around particular settings within our school. The positive behaviours will be explicitly taught in each setting.

This week's setting is the ***"whole school"***

### **Be Safe, Be Respectful, Be a Learner**

- ❖ Follow instructions during an emergency.
- ❖ Stay with your class and teacher at all times unless you are in another area of the school.
- ❖ Stay calm and quiet during an emergency so that teachers can ensure student safety.

#### **Discussion around expected behaviours:**

Questions:

- ❖ What is an emergency?
- ❖ What reasons might there be to necessitate an emergency signal?
- ❖ What are the steps involved when there is an evacuation or lock down emergency signal?
- ❖ What can happen if someone doesn't follow these expectations during the emergency?
- ❖ What do students do if they are in another area of the school during an emergency?

#### **Student activities:**

- ❖ Explicit modelling of class steps to follow when they hear the warning signals for an evacuation and a lock down.
- ❖ Participation in a whole school emergency drill.


