PBL: What does it mean when your child is awarded 'Tregeagle Eagle'?

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a very important part of the ethos of student wellbeing at Tregeagle Public School. It helps to establish positive social expectations for all in the school community and at Tregeagle we have 3 targets: Be Safe, Be Respectful and Be a Learner. PBL provides a framework for our school and our community to collectively support the wellbeing of every student. Each week, our PBL team uses data, systems and practices to explicitly teach behavioural expectations in different settings. Students are rewarded for demonstrating these behaviours in the playground and classroom by all staff. Each week, a student from each class is awarded the 'Tregeagle Eagle' award for consistently demonstrating the expected behaviours to the highest of their ability. This is a great honour in our school. Each week a photo of our 'Tregeagle Eagles' are published in the newsletter.

Peer Support

This term, Tregeagle Public School is coordinating a Peer Support program. All students from K-6 will participate in Peer Support for 40 minutes each week. Two peer leaders facilitate a group of younger students, who work together through a number of structured activities. Each teacher will supervise a group in their classroom. We are working on a module called *Relationships* helping us explore the concepts of friendship, building relationships and conflict management. Our first session enables the children to get to know everyone in their group, agreeing on how they will work together and interact cooperatively with others. They will also begin to think about the meaning of friendship. We encourage you to talk to your children about Peer Support every week as it will help to reinforce the concepts learned in each session.

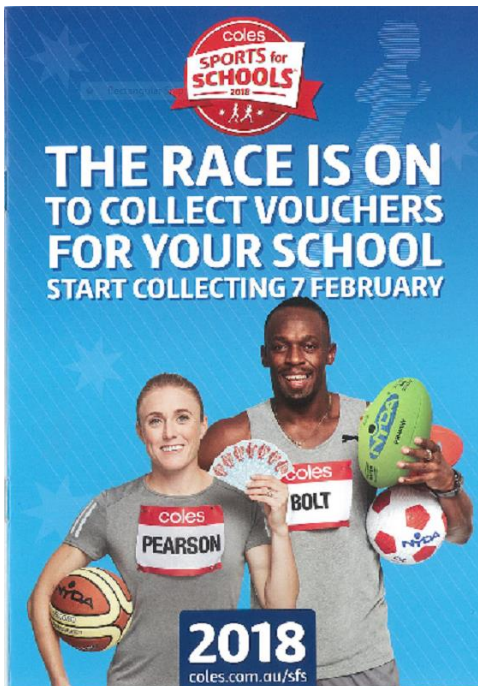

Brainy Breakfasts

- smoothies: mix any fruit with low fat dairy to keep them full
- cereal & milk
- muesli, fruit & yoghurt: you can make your own over the weekend & store for use throughout the week
- toast: toppers include avocado, beans or cheese & tomato
- toasted whole grain muffins
- overnight oats: just spoon out a portion in the morning. Frozen berries also work great!
- breakfast muffins: involve a little bit of weekend prep but are great for a grab & go breakfast on the way to school
