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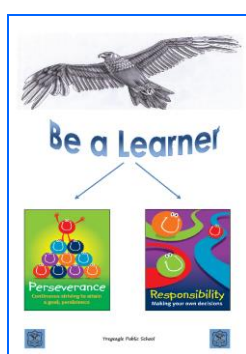

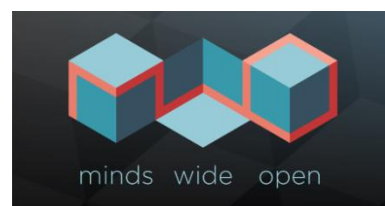
## ANZAC Day March

The school already tracks and monitors student progress, and the data provided from NAPLAN should essentially confirm what we already know. Students will be engaging in some NAPLAN practice activities over the next two weeks to become familiar with what this testing involves. It is different to how teachers assess on a daily/weekly basis and we want students to be relaxed about what is involved. At Tregeagle Public School we will still do NAPLAN via pencil and paper tests this year. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact your child's classroom teacher.

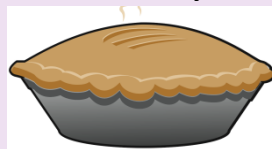


## **TREGEAGLE P&C PIE DRIVE FUNDRAISER**

The Child Oral Health Service would like to remind parents and carers of the importance of regular, supervised oral hygiene.

- When children start school they are often keen to be as independent as possible. Most children don't have the skills to brush their own teeth well enough to prevent decay until age 8-10, depending on their level of dexterity.
- Thorough brushing twice per day prevents significantly more dental decay than brushing once per day or less often.
- Help your child gently brush their teeth and gums twice per day with a small amount of fluoride toothpaste.



## Let's L K at Lunches

*Inspiration for fresh, fast & budget friendly lunchboxes  
from your local health service*

*Knowledge is knowing tomato is a fruit, wisdom is not putting it in a fruit salad*

This fortnight we thought we would explore the question - is all fruit equal? What is the difference between fruit, juice, dried fruit & fruit leathers? What should you encourage your kids to eat? Hopefully you enjoy reading it as much as we liked writing it!

### Compare the "pear"!

Fruit is packed full of important nutrients like vitamin C potassium, folate, fibre & phytochemicals. It is also a great source of natural sugars so is the perfect sweet treat in the lunchbox. BUT each level of processing tends to remove nutrients & concentrate the natural sugar content of the snack #freshisbest After all, it is easy to drink a glass of juice with breakfast & have a handful of dried fruit at recess... but would your child eat 3 apples & 8 apricots before lunch if they were to eat real fruit?



**JUICE** - 1 cup of juice often equals about 3 pieces of fruit!
