Visible Learning at Tregeagle Public School

Over the past 18 months, teachers at Tregeagle have been implementing elements of Visible Learning into their teaching programs to provide students with explicit quality criteria and feedback to promote effective learning. You may have heard the teachers or your child/ren speaking about learning intentions or success criteria. These two elements have been fundamental in allowing students to understand the expectations of them within a lesson, project or activity. I encourage you to discuss the learning intentions and success criteria your child/ren are working on at school to reinforce these concepts at home.

Learning Intentions *(The purpose of my learning)*

Learning Intentions are a clear statement that explains to the learner what concept, strategy or approach they will be learning. Learning Intentions allow learners to know what they are focusing on. Learning Intentions may be short term (one to two lessons) or long term (developed over a series of lessons).

Success Criteria *(What do I need to do to be successful?)*

The success criteria explain the things that learners need to do to achieve the learning intention. The success criteria can be created by the teacher or together with students in a lesson. Students can tick off criteria once they have achieved it, using it like a checklist for what to include, do or complete in a lesson.

Students are deeply engaging with these elements each day during their learning, allowing them to take more control over their own learning. As the learning concepts are different in every classroom, teachers have identified ways of visibly providing this information to students in ways that best fit the learners of their class. Students that engage with the learning intentions and success criteria have seen improved results and understanding of key concepts.
