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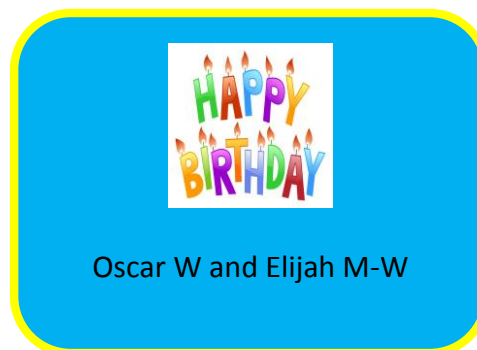

Students in Years 3 and 5 who sat the 2018 National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy tests earlier this year, have had their results sent home this week. They are an INDICATOR of performance, but should be judged against additional school based data and semester reports. Sometimes students perform surprisingly well in these tests, or alternatively find the experience confronting
