NAPLAN 2018

Tregeagle PS sent student NAPLAN reports out to parents/carers last week. Overall school wide results were pleasing. Both Year 3 and Year 5 cohorts achieved above national averages in all areas (reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation and numeracy). Teachers will now move into the analysis of student

results and pair this with their internal school data to use for planning of future teaching and learning. If you would like to discuss your child's NAPLAN results, please call the office to make an appointment with your child's classroom teacher.

Bus and Pedestrian Safety

Your primary aged child is still developing an understanding of danger and safety. While they are often keen to do things for themselves, an adult must always hold your child's hand when crossing the road. Remember:

- Always meet your child AT school or the bus stop. NEVER wait on the opposite side of the road and call them across.
- Always supervise your child and hold their hand when walking to and from the bus stop or interchange and when crossing the road until they are at least 10.
- Wait until the bus has gone then use a safe place to cross the road.
